



ANNUAL PRIZE

CCUE intends to award an annual prize of £200 for the best scholarly book by an early career academic working in an English department affiliated to CCUE. The first award will cover publications between 2008-2009. It is hoped that the prize will draw more public attention to the range and quality of the research produced by young scholars.

Eligible books include single-authored: scholarly editions, edited collections of scholarly essays, monographs, or textbooks. Creative writing, translations, and bibliographies are not eligible.

Submitted books should be by early career researchers who have completed a doctorate within the previous five years.

Judges will consider the following criteria in making the award:

- 1) originality: a significant contribution to understanding and knowledge of a field in literary studies.
- 2) significance: the timeliness of the work and its importance for the community of researchers and teachers.
- 3) rigour: qualities such as intellectual scope, methodological precision, and depth of scholarship.

Submissions will normally be made by Heads of Department (School, Division etc.) that are affiliated to CCUE. Two copies should be sent directly to CCUE (address below). The judges may exceptionally elect to consider any book that is eligible if they feel it should be taken into account, and in such cases they will communicate this decision to the relevant Head.

Deadline for submission: 30th June 2010

Awards will be announced at the OGM in December 2010.
